In Fiscal Year 2006, a record \$38.5 million in state agency procurements designated as set-asides were awarded to small Illinois companies – nearly triple the amount awarded the previous year – as you will see in the attached annual report for the State of Illinois Small Business Set-Aside Program.

The Department of Central Management Services has spared no effort to enable this success. To encourage potential vendors to participate in the Small Business Set-Aside Program, we took a number of significant actions including:

- Established a broad initiative called "Sell2Illinois" designed to increase competition for State business among small and diverse firms
- o Built a new website, sell2.illinois.gov, to provide information and resources on how to navigate the State's streamlined procurement process
- Held-69-workshops, presentations and networking events to communicate
 State contracting opportunities to thousands of small and diverse businesses
- Revised the Illinois Procurement Bulletin to increase transparency and provide more public information about contract opportunities, award notices, vendor participation and the purchasing decision-making process

As a result of these efforts, more than 1,500 additional small businesses are now engaged in the State procurement process, which is fostering greater competition for the State and expanding opportunities for these firms.

CMS will continue to build on these efforts to help small businesses grow their revenues, enhance their credentials and expand their capacity, which in turn spurs economic growth and job creation in communities throughout Illinois.

FY06 Annual Report Illinois Small Business Set-Aside Program

As you will see in the following pages, the State of Illinois nearly tripled the amount of business won by small Illinois firms last year. More than \$38 million in state agency procurements were awarded to qualified Illinois small businesses.

Executive Summary

In the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006, a record \$38.5 million in state agency procurements designated as set-asides were awarded to small Illinois companies – an increase of more than \$24 million and nearly triple the amount awarded the previous year. This success sprang from concerted efforts by the Department of Central Management Services and agency State Purchasing Officers to expand opportunities, strengthen processes and improve awareness of the Small Business Set-Aside Program (SBSA).

Since 2003, CMS has led many efforts to engage more small and diverse firms, alert them to contract opportunities and encourage them to compete for State business. During the first two years of the Blagojevich Administration, CMS reorganized and streamlined the state's procurement operations, which the National Association of State Procurement Officials recognized in 2004 with its highest honor, a Gold Cronin Award. Since then, the agency has worked hard to integrate the SBSA program into this statewide procurement structure and to increase State purchasing experts' awareness of and participation in this important program.

In Fiscal Year 2006 the agency took a number of significant actions, including:

- Established a broad initiative called "Sell2lllinois" designed to increase competition for State business among small and diverse firms
- Built a new website, sell2.illinois.gov, to provide information and resources on how to navigate the State's streamlined procurement process
- Held 69 workshops, presentations and networking events to communicate State contracting opportunities to thousands of small and diverse businesses
- Revised the Illinois Procurement Bulletin to increase transparency and provide more
 public information about contract opportunities, award notices, vendor participation and
 the purchasing decision-making process

These actions have borne fruit. As a result of the concerted efforts to grow the SBSA program – following the passage of critical legislation in 2004, which significantly increased the number of firms able to qualify for the program – CMS has:

- Registered an additional 1,500 small Illinois companies in the program, an increase of nearly 80%, from 1,925 on January 1, 2005 to 3,455 on June 30, 2006.
- Increased contracts set aside and awarded to small firms to \$38.5 million, a full 175% increase over the fiscal year 2005 total of \$14 million and more than six times the historical average.

More and more small Illinois companies are now competing for state business. And, most importantly, participation in the SBSA does serve to build the capacity of small firms and enhance their ability to compete: In addition to the nearly \$39 million that small companies won through the SBSA program (where they compete only against other small firms), they also won a significant amount of State business when competing outside the program – an estimated \$98 million last fiscal year.

CMS continues to monitor and seek ways to enhance the program, and continues to work with State purchasing experts from all agencies, boards and commissions under the Governor to promote and expand participation. We will continue to build on these efforts to help small businesses grow their revenues, enhance their credentials and expand their capacity, which in turn helps spur economic growth in communities throughout Illinois.
